Christopher Hulse, deputy editor of the Daily Telegraph, contributes article to various newspapers and periodicals. He is a Catholic in the Cathedral Parish of Westminster and a friend of Fr. Brian (Westminster). Following is a recent piece which appeared in the Tablet magazine.....

THE WIND TRIED to knock me over as I walked to evening Mass in Ramsey on the Isle of Man at the Church of Our Lady Star of the Sea, and St Maughold.

The new volume of the Pevsner Architectural Guides, covering the island for the first time, calls it the best of the twentieth-century or indeed nineteenth-century churches there, which is a lot.

The architect was Giles Gilbert Scott, from before the First World War, when he had been busy on Liverpool Anglican Cathedral. The tower is imposing and the tall chimneys of the presbytery a delight.

Being a Catholic on the island is no holiday. I was impressed by the daily devotion to parish responsibilities of Fr. Brian O'Mahony CSSp, who is, I think, 83 and has the Catholic church at Peel on the other side of the island to look after too.

There was mention of Pelagianism in the short sermon that windy night, and it was critical. A weekly Mass is offered for vocations. Although the Isle of Man is not in the United Kingdom, its people are ministered to by the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

I'd like to see a new generation of Manx missionaries to Great Britain.
