I'm writing these thoughts on the feast of Saint Pancras. I don't know about you, but when I think of St. Pancras, the first thing that comes to mind is the railway station in London. The station was named after the local area which takes its name from the church dedicated to St. Pancras; St. Pancras Old Church is one of the oldest sites of Christian worship in England. Pancras was a Roman citizen who converted to Christianity and was beheaded for his faith at the age of fourteen, around the year 304. A few years ago, we were given a statue of St. Pancras by a priest who was a fellow railway enthusiast.

Thinking about St. Pancras made me realise how many other Saints give their name to places and I certainly don't always stop and think about the Saint behind the place name. When you think of Kirk Michael, do you think of the Church of St. Michael? Or in our own parish, that Port St. Mary is dedicated to Our Lady? Then we have the parish of Maughold with its lighthouse, named after the Patron Saint of our Island.

Other places aren't quite as obvious – Andreas from St. Andrew, Bride from St. Bridget and Onchan from St. Conchan.

In the Middle Ages, the saints were seen as intercessors between people and God and also as our guardians in heaven, much as we might now think about guardian angels. Patron Saints were important for communities or different groups to give a focus. Perhaps some of that was folk religion, but I think we have lost some of that understanding of Saints, learning from their lives and asking for their help.

My resolution is that as I travel round the Island (or further afield) I think about the Saints who have given their names to places, find out a bit about them, and ask for their prayers. I invite you to do the same.
