Pope Francis: Do not be afraid to suffer criticism or economic loss to be faithful to the Gospel

Pope Francis has urged Christians not to be afraid of suffering criticism, economic loss, and persecution for being faithful to what the Church teaches. "There is a cost to remain faithful to what counts. The cost is going against the tide, freeing oneself from being conditioned by popular opinion, being separated from those who 'follow the current," Pope Francis said June 25. In his Sunday Angelus address, the Pope underlined how Jesus' words "do not be afraid" still apply today. He reflected in particular on Jesus' warning in the Gospel of Matthew: "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna" (Mt 10:28). Pope Francis said: "It was like saying: You do not need so much to be afraid of suffering misunderstanding and criticism, of losing prestige and economic advantages to remain faithful to the Gospel, but of wasting your existence in the pursuit of trivial things that do not fill life with meaning." The Pope explained how Jesus told his disciples not to be afraid shortly after telling them about the persecutions that they would have to undergo for the Gospel, something, he noted, that still applies today. "Since her beginning, in fact, the Church has experienced many persecutions, along with joys — of which there have been many. It seems paradoxical: The proclamation of the Kingdom of God is a message of peace and justice, founded on fraternal charity and on forgiveness; and yet it meets with opposition, violence, and persecution," he said. "Jesus, however, says not to fear, not because everything will be all right in the world, no, but because we are precious to his Father and nothing that is good will be lost."

Pope Francis added that Jesus' warning means that the only true fear one should have is of throwing one's life away chasing things that do not ultimately matter.
