It was great to see so many of you at last Sunday afternoon's celebration for my 75th Birthday and 50th Anniversary of my Ordination. The weather was perfect. The rain didn't fall until everyone had left for home. Thank you for your most generous cheque. I am really humbled by your kindness. It was good to share with you some of the highlights of my life in the rolling photo display. Approximately 230 adults attended along with children. It's good that a representative cross section of our parishioners made an effort to attend. Many have remarked on the informal friendly and happy atmosphere. The occasion made me feel proud to be your priest. Thanks to those of you who helped on the day. I was also moved by the Manx Bard's composition and personal delivery of a poem in my honour. I first got to know Michael Manning in his work for the Manx homeless charity, GRAIH, a charity which St Mary's, St Joseph's and St Anthony's have supported over the years.

The days following the celebration have seen a stark return to normality. Three **Marriage** rehearsals and one wedding, **Baptism** preparation and the start of our **Confirmation** Preparation classes along with meetings via zoom for the Archdiocese. Thirty-five young people from Ballakermeen, St Ninian's and QE2 High Schools attended our first session of Confirmation Preparation at Ballakermeen. We are grateful to Mr Graeme Corrin for allowing us to use BHS for our classes and to the teachers, Mr Gerard Murphy and Mr Peter Wiles, for leading the sessions.

Some fourteen families attended the most recent Baptism Preparation course in St Anthony's Pastoral Centre. It's great to hear parents and godparents answering the question 'Why do you want to have your child Baptised?' I tell them there are no wrong answers. Invariably they respond by saying that it's what their parents did for them and what their grandparents did for their parents. The book of Exodus speaks of God as the Father of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. Our faith is passed from generation to generation right up to the present day. That faith can be difficult to put into words. Most of us are ashamed that we don't have enough of it. We blow hot and cold. Faith is a gift, and we only get a little bit. But it's enough. Faith is a gift but we sometimes wonder if it's there at all. God is the stronger partner in this relationship and his faith in us is stronger than our faith in him. We are a community of faith and we often rely on the community to carry us in our faith.

In **Confirmation** our young people have the chance to make their own the faith they have inherited from their parents. They had no choice in their Baptism. They can now choose to be Confirmed. Their interactions and discussion within a group of their peers is invaluable in the development of a grown-up faith. It doesn't mean that their understanding and questioning of that faith is over. Faith is not static. It flexes and bends throughout our lives and sometimes seems to disappear. In Confirmation a young person is committed to continuing to explore what that faith might mean for ME. And that's a lifelong task.
