Dear Parishioners

It was wonderful to see so many people honouring Canon Brendan's memory by attending his funeral rites and praying for his eternal rest. The service of reception last Sunday evening had the feel of a family occasion. Although sad, there was a dignity and serenity about it. The Requiem Mass was a more formal occasion. The presence of Archbishop Malcolm and Bishop Tom and so many priests made it extra special. On both occasions, however, the people of the parish were at their best, taking pride in their priest who had given 33 years of his life to them. Also striking was the number of people attending who don't often make it to Mass; a reminder that our Catholic community is wider and more embracing than those we see on Sundays; and a reminder, too, that much of a priest's time and energy is spent in their service.

Canon Brendan's funeral was the first to take place on the Island for many years. He chose to remain on the Island after retirement. It was fitting that Canon Brendan's identification with Island life was celebrated in this way. And he chose to be buried here, in Braddan Cemetery, appropriately named St Brendan's in Manx Gaelic. The last such occasion was the funeral of Monsignor Turner. Peter Kelly has shared black and white photos of that funeral. Archbishop Heenan (later to be Cardinal) travelled to the Island to preside. This was in the days before concelebration. I could make out thirteen priests sitting in the choir stalls at St Mary's and then gathering around the open grave in the garden of St Mary's church. There is a tradition in every diocese that priests attend each other's funerals. On the Island that's not always possible. Among the sixteen priests attending Canon Brendan's funeral were fellow students, those whom he taught, and those who had served alongside him in parishes. May Canon Brendan rest in peace.

Canon Brendan's brother Des has asked me to pass on his thanks for the support Brendan received during his retirement and final illness. He was especially moved by the numbers who attended the vigil and the Requiem Mass. It was a comfort for him to see how highly regarded Canon Brendan was.

This week, 1,500 people from the Archdiocese will be heading to Lourdes in a historic year which marks 100 years since the first pilgrimage from Liverpool. The Archdiocese of Liverpool is the first diocese in England to reach this milestone. Since 1923, hundreds of thousands of people from across the Archdiocese have made the journey over to the south of France every year, with the exception of World War II and the Covid pandemic. My own Mum and Dad took part in those pilgrimages before the war and before they married. They always spoke of those special days when foreign travel, even to neighbouring France, was rare. It was an arduous journey by train and ferry. The French trains in those days had basic wooden seats and the journey through France alone took twenty-four hours and there was no air conditioning.......

This year's pilgrimage will begin on **Friday 21-28 July** and will be led by Archbishop Malcolm. Pilgrims, volunteers and medical staff will travel by air on chartered flights from Liverpool John Lennon airport. A 'Jumbulance', a specially adapted and fully accessible coach, will travel overland with 7 assisted pilgrims.

Our young people today continue to have that same opportunity. Although less arduous, it is still an adventure and the memory will stay with them for the rest of their lives. Three hundred young people, making up the Liverpool Youth Pilgrimage, will travel on coaches from Chorley, Knowsley, Isle of Man, Leyland, Liverpool, St Helens, Sefton, Warrington, Widnes and Wigan, leaving in the early hours of Thursday 20 July to begin the 24-hour journey. When they arrive, many of the young people will get up as early as 4.30am to work in the hospital, while others assist pilgrims to the various places of devotion and Masses.

Not all of us can take part in the pilgrimage. We can however identify with our pilgrims, our sick people and their helpers in a virtual 'mini pilgrimage'. We can commend to Mary's prayers all of our sick parishioners and friends and those who care for them. At each of our Masses during the pilgrimage we will be saying the Lourdes Pilgrimage Centenary Prayer and reciting a decade of the rosary.
