Ordinary Time - Extraordinary Time

Today is the 21st Sunday of 'Ordinary' Time in the Church calendar, though it is an extraordinary week which records the great faith of our forefathers and foremothers. In other years, today the 27th, would be the feast day of St. Monica, mother of St. Agustine, that great Bishop (of Hippo), Doctor of the Church and author, famous for his writing of *The Confessions*. We celebrate his feast tomorrow (Monday 28th). On Tuesday we celebrate the second feast day of John the Baptist, of whom Jesus said that he was the greatest of the sons of men. In June we celebrated his life, this week we celebrate his death. On Wednesday, Thursday and Friday we celebrate the faith and martyrdom of English men and women: people of great faith. Faith in the face of adversity.

What do these memorials and feast days tell us? St. Agustine spent many years in search of truth and found it in Christ. St. Ambrose of Milan had a great influence upon him and his understanding of Christianity. His mother, Monica was a devout Christian and prayed for many years for Agustine's conversion, which came before her own death. The English martyrs, priests and lay people were men and women of great faith, who refused to deny their faith and as a consequence were executed. Their lives would have been far easier had they denied the truth. They chose to hold to the truth, to their relationship with God, in great adversity.

While we don't expect to, and I hope won't, be martyred for our faith, these great people of faith through the ages are beacons for us in our own faith journeys. To come to a real understanding of our own faith and form a genuine personal relationship with God takes time and effort on our behalf.

We need to make space in our busy lives to embrace God, to listen to him, to understand what he is asking of us and to act on that call.
