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Father Philip writes

At the service at the chapel of Saint Adamnan last Wednesday we reflected upon the word of Mother Julian of Norwich, an Anchoress who lived in East Anglia between the years 1343-1416.

The greatest honour we can give Almighty God is to live gladly because of the knowledge of His love

An Anchoress (or , if a man, an anchorite) is a person who lives a solitary life of contemplation. For Julian this meant living in a small cell attached to one of the churches in Norwich at that time: she would have been supported by the donations of the local people and in her turn she would pray with and for the people of the town, making herself available for giving spiritual advice and guidance to anyone who came to the window of her cell.

Perhaps her most famous addition to our spirituality today is the book *The Revelations (or showings) of Divine Love* in which she reflects powerfully on the passion of the Lord Jesus as the sign and expression of his total giving-of-self, the love which he has for each and every one of us. It is because of this love that Julian says we can live **'gladly'** that doesn't mean going round with a fixed grin all the time , pretending that nothing ever weighs us down or upsets us in this life! To live gladly is an attitude of life, respecting the dignity and potential of each and every life, at every stage of life, seeking always to do the best we can in whatever circumstance we find ourselves.

At each Mass we make the following prayer... to which I am sure Mother Julian would say a profound **Amen**!

Deliver us Lord we pray from every evil. Graciously grant peace in our days. In your mercy keep us free from sin and protect us from all distress as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
