My ways are not your ways

In today's first reading, Isaiah speaking for the Lord says "for my thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways are not your ways". As Christians, we need to remember that God knows what he is doing and does it in his way, not the way we might expect.

It's very useful to remember this when we look at today's Gospel. You will notice that the landowner offered the first group 1 denarius which was the usual amount for a day's work. As he realised that more workers were needed, he went and got them and said he'd give them a fair wage, without specifying the amount. Remember that when the crops are ready, time is of the essence to gather it. It may well have been that these later groups were ill or infirm and unable to do a full day's work, but could do a few hours.

At the end of the day, the late comers were paid first and were pleasantly surprised to receive a full day's pay of 1 denarius. The first group didn't mind as if the landowner was being generous, they expected a nice bonus. But they only got the 1 denarius that had been agreed and (in human terms) it's easy to see why they were aggrieved. The landowner pointed out that they had got what was agreed and if he wanted to be generous with others, that was up to him.

The Rabbis were not against receiving repentant sinners who would be encouraged to return to the fold. But they couldn't expect to be treated equally. God is different. The slate really is wiped clean.

God is just and will always come good on his promises. But he's also generous and we should not be envious if he gives more to others. He is so full of love that he wants to pour out his gifts on anyone who will accept them. Those who have had the privilege of serving him the longest should not begrudge those who, for whatever reason, are late coming to his service.

As a footnote, the harvest is now. We are being asked to help support those in need and support those looking for meaning in life. We need to act now. If you haven't done things in the past, don't worry. You'll get your reward and the past will be forgotten.
