Dear Parishioners

Last Sunday's first reading was taken from the Book of Wisdom. I remarked how Wisdom is described in feminine terms. Wisdom is a gift of the Holy Spirit. We might even say that the Holy Spirit and Wisdom are the same. During the past week we have been reading from the Book of Wisdom each day at Mass. The passage chosen for Thursday is worth a second look. It speaks for itself.

Within Wisdom is a spirit intelligent, holy, unique, manifold, subtle, active, incisive, unsullied, lucid, invulnerable, benevolent, sharp, irresistible, beneficent, loving to man, steadfast, dependable, unperturbed, almighty, all-surveying, penetrating all intelligent, pure and most subtle spirits; for Wisdom is quicker to move than any motion; she is so pure, she pervades and permeates all things. She is a breath of the power of God, pure emanation of the glory of the Almighty; hence nothing impure can find a way into her. She is a reflection of the eternal light, untarnished mirror of God's active power, image of his goodness. Although alone, she can do all; herself unchanging, she makes all things new. In each generation she passes into holy souls, she makes them friends of God and prophets; for God loves only the man who lives with Wisdom. She is indeed more splendid than the sun, she outshines all the constellations; compared with light, she takes first place, for light must yield to night, but over Wisdom evil can never triumph. She deploys her strength from one end of the earth to the other, ordering all things for good. (The Book of Wisdom 7:22-8:1)

Last weekend Anglican poet, priest and academic Malcolm Guite visited the Island. He spoke movingly about Poetry and Prayer. Here is his poem about Wisdom.

I cannot think unless I have been thought, Nor can I speak unless I have been spoken. I cannot teach except as I am taught, Or break the bread except as I am broken. O Mind behind the mind through which I seek, O Light within the light by which I see, O Word beneath the words with which I speak, O founding, unfound Wisdom, finding me, O sounding Song whose depth is sounding me, O Memory of time, reminding me, My Ground of Being, always grounding me, My Maker's Bounding Line, defining me, Come, hidden Wisdom, come with all you bring, Come to me now, disguised as everything. This week I attended a meeting of deans. The Isle of Man is one of thirteen deaneries across the Archdiocese. One of the things we shared was the number of angry and abusive emails we receive from parishioners. It was a reassuring conversation – I thought I was the only priest to get them. And, of course, appreciative comments from grateful parishioners make up for it.

Next Saturday, 25th November, the first-ever Archdiocesan Synodal Council meets in Liverpool. Clergy and lay members from each of the thirteen Deanery Synodal Councils in the Archdiocese will be taking part. Brian Murphy is the member for St Mary & St Joseph's and Win Kewley for St Anthony's. The main item on the agenda will be to report progress on implementation of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan and to discuss the way forward. The Isle of Man Deanery Synodal Council will be taking part via zoom. All parishioners can watch online and be a part of this gathering.
