## **Dear Parishioners**

Christmas is a time to say thank you. We give thanks for the birth of Jesus. And it's an opportunity for me to thank you. Thank you for the contribution you make to the life of our parishes. And thank you for the many cards, gifts and messages of encouragement and support. They are much appreciated.

I'm conscious of travel difficulties to and from the Island both by air and by sea. Our supermarket shelves and postal deliveries also face disruption. The uncertainty seems more acute this Christmas. We pray that our Christmas plans aren't ruined. Having said that, the first Christmas didn't go to plan either.....

We are living in a time of two major wars. That's in addition to the drawn-out conflicts elsewhere that rarely hit the news. Wars and climate change are the biggest drivers of migration but politicians would have us believe refugees and migrants are responsible for their own misfortune. The movement of people in vast numbers is a new reality that we all have to face. We can't simply put up walls, physical or virtual, to keep people out. How do we respond to this scale of human suffering? This imperfect world is the one Jesus was born to save.

Each family has had its own milestones to celebrate this year, some sad and some happy. This past year has been an eventful one for me, too. My sister Mary died at the beginning of February. Canon Brendan died in the summer. There were also happy times as I celebrated both my 75<sup>th</sup> birthday in May and 50 years as a priest in June. It was great to be able to share those events with parishioners on the Island and with family and friends across. And then we had the wonderful news that Saint Mary's was to be given cathedral status. Although our parishes are our people, not our buildings, it is people who make our buildings special. Generations of parishioners who have gone before us will share the same pride we all feel in our cathedral church. It's an honour both for the parish and the Island. A big thank you is due to all those who made these events memorable. I'm hoping for a quieter year in 2024......

The list of people to thank is endless. And I fear missing anybody out: our cleaners, stewards, readers, eucharistic ministers, our choirs, catechists, flower arrangers, servers, office staff, collectors, counters, KSC, SVP and Memory Support group. It's a privilege to be your priest. A Happy, Peaceful and Blessed Christmas to you and your families.

## I share this Christmas poem by Malcolm Guite:

O secret seed, O hidden spring of light. Come to us Wisdom, come unspoken Name Come Root, and Key, and King, and holy Flame, O quickened little wick so tightly curled, Be folded with us into time and place, Unfold for us the mystery of grace And make a womb of all this wounded world.
