Racial Justice Day

Not long after our Christmas season of Joy and not long before we enter our Lenten period of preparation for Easter, the very essence of and central focus of our faith, we are in this short period of what is called *Ordinary Time*. It is appropriate therefore for us to draw breath between these pinnacles of our faith and have some time of reflection. How fitting therefore, it is that we mark today as Racial Justice Day. How sad that we need to do so but also how appropriate that we should.

We recently celebrated Jesus' arrival, not just for the Jewish nation but for all the world, for all humankind, for all peoples for the world. God's call to us was and is for *all* the world: it is a call to and for *all* people, not the few. Jesus came for everyone. We will soon celebrate the great feast of Easter – not just Easter Sunday. We will see, hear, and share the Life, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus through the services of Easter – the Tridium. We will hear of the message Jesus gives us, the sharing of his gifts with us, the behaviour of mankind toward him (the good and the bad) and of His victory over death – our Salvation. It is salvation for *all*, if we have ears to hear, eyes to see, hearts to believe.

Racial Justice Day calls us, challenges us all, to understand that Jesus is for everybody. His call is universal. There is no 'us and them'. By understanding that, we can and will see Jesus in the face of everybody we meet – young or old, male, or female, rich or poor, of all faiths and none: in *all* peoples and in *all* races of the world. If we can do that, then we will see racial justice today *and* every day.
