"The Family that Prays Together Stays Together"

God starts relationship with people. Last Sunday, I said that God takes the initiative and calls man into relationship with Him, and to reveal Himself who He is, and I gave two examples from Scripture, that it was God who took initiative to call Abram "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you". (Gen 12:1) It was God who took initiative to call, Moses and revealed Himself who he is, "I have heard the cry of my people, I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring forth my people..." (Ex 3:10) tell them, "I AM has sent me to you" (Ex 3:14) This call of persons into relationship with God did not end with Abram, Moses, and the prophets but continues to this day. God still calls us, and we call upon him (in prayers of Praise and Adoration) asking him for our needs as we pray in the prayer Jesus taught us - Our Father (Prayer of Petitions) and for the needs of our fellow brothers and sisters (Prayer of Intercessions) When God calls we must respond in faith, respond and dialogue with God, listen to Him and trust in Him. So, prayer is a relationship with God.

<u>Prayer and Incarnation</u>. God who created man in his image and likeness, in the incarnation, out of his love for his people, through Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit He became man so that He can be in close relationship with his people. So, through the Incarnation (God became man) and Emmanuel (God with his people) to make ecclesia or fellowship with God through Jesus Christ possible so that in the guidance of the Holy Spirit the believers can praise, adore, give thanks, ask for their needs, intercede for others, and learn more of God's will for their lives.
