Dear Parishioners

This week **Her Majesty the Queen** visited the island. I was introduced to Queen Camilla by the Mayor. As the mayor's chaplain I composed and led the prayers in the Council chamber at the start of the ceremony in which Douglas's status as a city was formally granted. The Queen read the speech that King Charles would have delivered had he been well enough to attend. In that speech the Cathedral Church of Saint Mary of the Isle got a mention as the new Co-Cathedral to the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King in Liverpool.

Living on the island, it's not often I get to priests' funerals. As well as supporting their families and friends, clergy funerals provide an opportunity to share memories with fellow priests. These evoke peals of laughter in the sacristy as we recall the absurdities of life in the seminary and our times together in parishes over the years. On Tuesday I was at the funeral of **Canon Vincent Burrowes**. He was 97, probably the last of a number of priests who were called up during the Second World War. For Vincent, as with several others, this involved a break in his seminary training at Upholland. But his time in the army did as much (if not more) for his future life as a priest as years studying theology and canon law.

We no longer have our own seminary. **St Joseph's College Upholland** finally closed its doors at the turn of the Millenium. In its heyday it housed a community of hundreds of seminarians and staff. I had already spent thirteen years there as a student. After my return from Peru, I spent a further ten years exploring endless potential alternative uses for the building. It was considered by the Home Office as a possible prison; by the army as a training centre; by a Bank as a headquarters; by Pru Leith as a centre for cuisine throughout the ages; by the Muslim Community as a girls' boarding school; by a university as a centre for students from the US. One potential buyer considered installing a glass roof over the quadrangle to make it into a Zoo. Another proposed installing a miniature railway; yet another saw its future as an international equestrian centre; all to no avail.

Canon Vincent was an Upholland man. And so were Bishop John Rawsthorne who presided at his funeral and Fr Bill Murphy who preached the homily. As they talked of Vincent's seminary days it more effectively triggered my own memories as a student than the ten extra years I lived there in a forlorn shell. I reconnected once again with the shared rigours of seminary life and the humour that enabled us to survive, and maybe thrive. Upholland's legacy isn't entirely obliterated. At a recent Archdiocesan meeting of deans, we realised that only one of the thirteen deans hadn't spent some years there as part of their journey to ordination.

I met one priest at Canon Vincent's funeral who wasn't an Upholland man, **Monsignor Peter Ryan**, former parish priest at St Mary's. Originally an Anglican priest, Peter trained at the Beda College in Rome. He has recently returned to the Archdiocese after some years' retirement in Leamington. He looks amazingly well for a priest in his nineties. Monsignor Peter asked me to 'kiss the Island on both cheeks'. I invited him to visit us. He's looking forward to it.

The **Isle of Man Deanery Synodal Council** met on Thursday evening. Members considered the report of the **Archdiocesan Synodal Council** (ASC) held on 25th November 2023. Members from the Isle of Man had participated via live stream.

Discussion at Thursday's meeting considered the 2nd 'Area' or theme **'Becoming A Church That Accompanies People Through Life'** and considered what that might mean on the Island. Some felt the church had always been open to those on the edges. Others recognised that the church was increasingly adopting a less judgmental approach when engaging with Catholics who, although not regular attenders, still turned to the church at key moments in their lives. A recent survey from the Catholic Diocese of Brentwood indicated that three-quarters of those who no longer attended church still identified as Catholic.

It was also agreed that the Island's priests would resume the practice of periodic 'pulpit swaps' and that steps be taken to identify ways in which we might better engage with young people.

Members also felt that the 'Families of Parishes' initiative, highlighted in the Archbishop's recent Pastoral Letter, might be better publicised. This concept describes how individual parishes cluster together to share resources etc. Taking into account the geographical realty of life on the Island, three Families of Parishes have been identified:

St Patrick, Our Lady Star of the Sea + St Maughold. Peel/Ramsey

St Mary + St Columba. Castletown/Port Erin

St Mary of the Isle + St Joseph, St Anthony of Padua. Douglas/ Onchan

It was noted that the two churches in Castletown and Port Erin already work in partnership and constitute a single parish. The full report and responses from the ASC meeting are available at the back of church. Fr John
