Dear Parishioners,

As I write, the weather forecast promises sunshine this weekend. I find it easier to reflect convincingly on the Resurrection when the sun is shining. These weeks are special weeks. At Mass each day we follow the story in the Acts of the Apostles of the rapid expansion of the Christian faith to cover much of the known world. The presence of the Holy Spirit is palpable.

The voice of Jesus throughout John's Gospel is distinctive. Unlike his voice in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus speaks throughout his public ministry as if he is risen already. In the Gospel passage at Mass last Thursday Jesus says 'No one can come to me unless he is drawn by the Father who sent me'. It is our faith that 'draws us' to Jesus. We are only drawn through the Spirit working in us. Faith is a gift. Each of us has a spark of faith, but it's enough. We can ask the Father to increase our faith. In the words of St Paul, we can fan that spark of faith into a flame. Or we can allow it to remain dormant.

Current events in our broken world from war in Gaza, Ukraine and elsewhere; climate change and its effects; the cost-of-living crisis; political polarisation and extremism – these are the contexts in which we are challenged to live out our faith. Do we fight the 'world' and its distorted values with the world's own weapons or do we follow the way of faith – the way of apparent weakness and failure? In the pages of the Acts of the Apostles a handful of disillusioned followers of Jesus take on both the Jewish establishment and the Roman Empire. They had faith in their own gift of faith.

In these weeks we also read the story of St Paul and his conversion. He was a religious fanatic, a 'God botherer' who felt called to tell everyone where they were going wrong and to lock them up for it. The frightening thing was that he thought he was doing God's work. His encounter with Christ opened his eyes to the blindness of his ways. No longer in charge, he in turn became a prisoner in chains, in and out of gaol. But he was free. In these Easter days we pray that we too, may capture something of the dynamism and resilience of those first Christians.

The Spirit is present wherever people live by love, witness to the truth, act in solidarity and practice compassion. Wherever such realities are manifest in human beings, anywhere in the world, it is a sign that the Spirit has come upon them and is active within them. It is by the inspiration of the Spirit that poets and writers redraw life with all its lights and shadows, its dramas and achievements. They are seized by an inner light, and by energies that prompt unexpected connections; they bring something new into the world. Many writers confess that they feel possessed by an inner energy (a daimon, a good spirit) that seizes them and makes them think and write.

By the inspiration of the Spirit, artists and artisans elicit from their material—wood, stone, marble, granite—an image that only they can see in it. The material is spiritualized, and the spirit is materialized.... The Spirit is especially intense in music. Sounds are invisible, unconstrained by space and time, just as no one can limit the action of the Spirit. And the melodies they project lift up and penetrate the soul; in them we find comfort, beauty to cry over, soaring joy. The great evangelical theologian Karl Barth used to say that Mozart took his wonderful melodies from heaven and the Breath (the Holy Spirit).

The arts are very much like the Spirit. They are intangible. They are ends in themselves. They have an intrinsic value.... Art, music, and poetry in themselves are priceless. They are unique creations, not serial productions. They are like a gift we give to a loved one, valuable for its own sake. Somehow they escape the limits of time and bring us a foretaste of eternity. Inspiration is in the air and settles on people without regard for their skin colour, their social background or their educational level. How many illiterate artists have emerged in marginal communities and were never noticed: poets, artisans, painters, singers, musicians, mystics? Boasting is not the Spirit's way; it is like water that quietly runs along the ground, fills the vessels it is poured into, and always chooses to run downhill.

That is why the Spirit does not have its own figure, as the Father and the Son do. It is portrayed as a dove, but what is important is the radiant light it gives off. It is the Breath (Spiritus in Latin) that reveals life, sustains life and renews life in every way. The universe and all beings are saturated with Spirit. To recognize its presence in every corner of the cosmos is the work of spirituality, of life in the Spirit. (Leonardo Boff)
