"The Family that Prays Together Stays Together"

Archdiocesan Synodal Council 2023, Part 2:

At the start of the Council Meeting, we were addressed by Bishop Beverley Mason, Suffragan Bishop of Warrington. This is part of that address:

"It is an immense honour to be standing here today. I would like to thank Archbishop Malcolm for the invitation to offer an opening reflection. This is an exciting time as you look to intensify our Lord's ministry and be a more visible and proactive presence in the name of Christ. These are unquestionably challenging times when people are being led away from the Truth. There is so much fear, isolation, hopelessness, and despair! People don't know where to turn to find love and self-worth – and are scrabbling in the dark.

Today, this is probably the most faith-illiterate generation of all time. People don't know that God has lived among us in Jesus Christ, they have no comprehension of the resurrection or the second coming. We are called to come alongside, to build partnerships and to make Jesus known. The biggest blockage to mission is our self-consciousness and confidence. Remember who it is who calls you. And remember that He is with you!

When St Paul was commissioned to go out as the apostle to the Gentiles, St Peter tasked him to 'Remember the Poor'. And to us all here, I would like to add 'And in God's name, remember the children'. As a reminder that you are under the Divine Mercy, I'd love to present you with a small gift. It's a hand-carving of the Divine Mercy that was commissioned by a beautiful Christian couple who are devout servants at the shrine in Medjugorje. May there be rich fruit drawn for your labours! Amen".

I have the full text available: she was certainly an inspirational speaker, which led us to discuss the merits of women in leadership in the church during lunch.

Assisted Dying: We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all those who attended the government roadshow at Castle Rushen High School on Monday evening, in an effort to voice their concerns regarding assisted dying. Despite the long queues and limited opportunities to engage with the ministers, many individuals from the parish participated in one-on-one discussions and actively took part in the panel discussion. This exemplifies the true essence of the church in action. Once again, we express our appreciation to those who stepped out of their comfort zone to advocate for the vulnerable.

In the beginning of May, the Members of the House of Keys (MHKs) will meticulously review the assisted dying bill, scrutinizing each clause. This will be followed by a third reading of the bill. Although a number of MHKs expressed concerns, they still voted in favour of the bill during the second reading. In order to defeat the bill, we require at least five of these MHKs to vote against it during the third reading. If you haven't already done so, we urge you to email or attempt to engage in one-on-one discussions with the undecided MHKs. Your voice matters and can make a difference.
