Archdiocesan Synodal Council 2023: Part 7

Becoming a Church that honours the vocation of all the baptised.

The original stated intention was to grow in understanding the baptised calling of all. Progress had been made in developing a postgraduate certificate in leadership in pastoral ministry, to be provided by Liverpool Hope University. It will form part of the diaconate training, but it will also be relevant to the formation for the lay ministry of catechist, and more general formation for ministry. Further collaborative work with other agencies will be required to establish the postgraduate certificate for lay ministry. The Archdiocese is also developing a plan for employing lay pastoral workers in Families of Parishes, but this is at an early stage, and it is unclear how it is to be funded. The proposals I have seen may not be easy to implement in the Isle of Man and we may need to develop other initiatives.

The reference is to all the baptised, and so includes those we do not see in the churches. A diocese in the south of England realised that their congregations had halved in 7 years. They conducted a survey. It is unlikely that those most alienated responded, but, of those who did, 70% self-identified as Catholics. Most of us have family or friends who are no longer churchgoers. Is their absence down to Sunday football or the 24/7 lifestyle? Looking around the churches, it is obvious that have a missing generation. What have we got wrong? Have our attitudes towards "unconventional" families made people feel uncomfortable? If the church is to fulfil its mission to all the baptised, we need to discover how we can meet the needs of all the baptised.

- Mandatory Use: Required for all Catholic parishes and Mass centres in England, Wales, and Scotland

This new Lectionary is designed to enrich the scriptural experience during Mass, making the readings more understandable and meaningful for the faithful.
