Archdiocesan Synodal Council 2023: Part 4

Becoming a church that renews its organisational structures and administers its property to serve its mission. The Archdiocese has implemented new deanery structures, establishing Deanery Synodal Councils (DSCs) in each deanery, chaired by a layperson. Formation training has yet to take place for Deans and the Chairs and Members of DSCs. The Families of Parishes have been identified and their details were published during the inaugural meeting of the Archdiocesan Synodal Council (ASC). Most Families consist of a number of Parishes in close geographical proximity, who will share resources, and it is intended that if one priest is away, the others in the Family will provide cover, reducing the need to find "supply" priests. The Isle of Man is different. In size, we are about 1/3 of the area of the Archdiocese, but largely rural, with larger distances between the churches. We are split into 3 Families based on the geographical location of parishes. Castletown and Port Erin is unique in the Archdiocese, being both a single parish and a Family!

An audit of property has taken place to identify surplus buildings which could be disposed of or put to other use. The audit found no surplus property on the Isle of Man, St Joseph's Willaston having already been leased to Living Hope Church, which has taken on responsibility for repairs and maintenance of the building. This has allowed the various social purposes for which the presbytery was used to continue.

Some DSCs are already exploring different models of leadership by priests, deacons or laymen and women. The Archdiocese is committed to becoming a synodal and mission-oriented church and is providing resources to facilitate this.

Assisted Dying Bill: A demonstration against Assisted Dying Bill takes place on Tuesday 14 May 2024, from 8.30 am to 10 am outside the Tynwald Building, Douglas. Please join us if you can.

Two clauses have already been debated in the House of Keys on Tuesday 7 May, and those of us trying to mount an opposition to the Assisted Dying Bill feel we need to protest outside the Tynwald Building when the clauses are debated again this Tuesday.

The upcoming demonstration will mirror the one held on 31 October last year, characterized by silence and respect as the MHKs arrive at the Tynwald building in Douglas. We received significant support from parishioners during the previous demonstration, and we hope to see an equally large turnout this time.

We should back our MHKs who are against assisted dying and ensure that the undecided individuals are aware of our support. A large demonstration was organized by the pro-assisted dying group on Tuesday in preparation for the first debate on the clauses, and they intend to return next week to continue their efforts. It is important for us to also be visible to prevent the MHKs and the public from assuming that there is overwhelming support for assisted dying. The BBC will be present on Tuesday to cover the demonstration.

We will once again utilize the slogans "Bin the Bill", "Protect the Vulnerable", "Save our Health Service", and "No Intentional Killing" for our cause. Kindly ensure that you bring bins displaying the "Bin the Bill" slogan prominently, and/or create placards as large as possible.

Please wear black and white.
