From Canon Philip.....

Ardent but gentle..... in popular devotion June is often kept as the month of the Sacred Heart and indeed on 7th of the month the Liturgy keeps the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. For many generations a devotion and love of the heart of Jesus was presumed when you made the profession of faith ' he became incarnate of the Holy Spirit and was made man'. To be human is not merely to have an organ which pumps the blood around the body but to have a seat of emotion, love, care and compassion. It is not only on February 14th that the heart pierced with the arrow of love comes to the fore of our attention (at least in the card shops...) – in our Christian spirituality the pierced heart of Jesus on the Cross (sometimes in iconography surrounded by the crown of thorns) becomes the source and the inspiration of all loving and serving in the Church and for the world.

For raised up high on the Cross, he gave himself up for us with a wonderful love and poured out blood and water from his pierced side, the wellspring of the Church's Sacraments, so that, won over to the open heart of the Savior, all might draw water joyfully from the springs of salvation.
