Father Philip writes.

On 11th of this month the Church keep the Feast of Saint Benedict, Abbot, Co-Patron of Europe. Benedict was born in the central Italian mountain town of Norcia (Nursia) around AD 480 and spent some time in Rome as a student - but finding the Roman life too much for him, he went firstly to Subiaco and then to Monte Cassino, where he put the final words to the RULE OF LIFE which he wrote for those who like him, wanted to live a life of WORK and PRAYER.

There was a radio programme on BBC (other radio stations are available!) called The Listening Project which had as its strap-line It's surprising what you hear when you listen.

There is a sense in which the project which people call 'synodality' could be presented at its roots as a project of respectful listening- listening, as Saint Benedict puts it in the prologue to his Rule of Life, with 'the ears of the heart'.

When in 1964 Pope Paul VI declared Benedict to be a Patron Saint for all Europe he reflected on the fact that he was Messenger of peace, molder of union, teacher of civilization, and above all herald of the religion of Christ and founder of monastic life in the West.

The gifts of PEACE, of UNITY and of CIVILITY – virtues which the nations could well learn to foster and which will fruitfully begin with each one of us in our everyday living.

Prefer nothing to the love of Christ

Benedict advises his monks and he also speaks to us – place the love of Christ at the foundation of everything you do, have Him as the goal and purpose of your living.

Pie in the sky? unattainable idealism? Or a vision where PEACE, UNITY and CIVILITY can thrive because they are firmly founded?

As GK Chesterton wrote "Christianity has not been tried and found wanting; it has been found difficult and therefore not tried "
