REFLECTION ON THE LORD'S PRAYER – Give us this day our daily bread.

Jesus presented the Lord's prayer to the disciples in answer to their request for him to teach them how to pray. When we look at it, we need to consider the structure as well as the content.

We are now halfway through the Lord's Prayer, and this is the first time we ask for something. Up until now we have praised God and asked that his will be done. We're now asking for what we need. And it's very important to note that we're asking for our needs, not our wants. We're asking to be fed, not given exotic, rich food. Nor are we asking for a year's supply, but please give us what we need one day at a time.

There is a clear link here to today's first reading. The Israelites had been freed from slavery but thought they were going to starve in the desert. So, Moses asks the Lord, and the Lord sends manna from Heaven. Each day, the people can collect what they need. If we read slightly further than today's passage, we see that Moses tells the people not to keep any of what they have collected until the following day, but some ignore him and save some, only to find it gets infested with maggots. The Lord gives us what we need but we shouldn't take more.

Last Sunday's Gospel was the feeding of the 5,000. Jesus took the small amount available and proceeded to feed everyone. If we are prepared to offer God the little, we have, he will look after us. Today's Gospel shows that it is not just our physical needs God looks after, but our spiritual ones as well. So, when we ask for our daily bread, we are also asking for that spiritual food; Jesus is the bread of life. He will come to us each day if we ask. We must want Him and ask for what we need (not want).
