REFLECTION ON THE LORD'S PRAYER The Concluding Doxology

Catholics do not usually say the Concluding Doxology ("For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory for ever and ever") at the end of the Lord's Prayer although most Protestants do.

A short, hymn-like verse that exalts the glory of God such as the Doxology is often used to conclude formal prayers. It is included in the very earliest Christian liturgies: The Didache (The Lord's Teaching Through the Twelve Apostles to the Nations) from the 1st Century and the Apostolic Constitutions (around the year 380). English translations of Matthew's Gospel based on late Byzantine Greek manuscripts included the Doxology, but it is absent in the oldest manuscripts and is now not considered to be part of the original text.

William Tyndale's New Testament translation in 1526 (the year before Henry VIII asked for his marriage to be annulled leading to the English Reformation) included the Doxology. This translation influenced the First Prayer Book of Edward VI in 1549 and cemented the Doxology in Protestant services.

Whilst we do not usually include the Doxology in our private prayers, since 1970 it has been included at Mass. After the Lord's Prayer the Priest says the Embolism, a prayer that expands on the last petition in the Lord's Prayer: "Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ." We then respond with the Doxology.

The Doxology takes up, by inclusion, the first three petitions to our Father: the glorification of his name, the coming of his reign, and the power of his saving will. But these prayers are now proclaimed as adoration and thanksgiving, as in the liturgy of heaven. Christ gives the three titles of kingship, power, and glory to His Father and Our Father, until the end of time when the mystery of salvation will be brought to its completion and God will be all in all.

Novena: A Novena is a traditional Catholic prayer practice lasting nine consecutive days. It involves specific prayers with a particular intention, often seeking divine intercession, help, or the intervention of a saint. Novenas can be private, with family, or in group settings such as church. They are associated with petitions for healing, guidance, or divine assistance but can also be prayers of thanksgiving. This practice is rooted in the early Christian tradition, modelled after the nine days the Apostles and Mary spent in prayer between Jesus' ascension and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. You're all invited to the Novena of our Lady of Rushen in St. Mary's Church Castletown starting on Wednesday 4th, at 7.PM and concludes on Thursday, the 12th, with the Memorial Mass of Our Lady of Rushen.
