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From the Presbytery Desk....

Lord to whom else shall we go ?..... The response of Peter in today's Gospel sums up well our attitude to the wisdom which Jesus brings into our lives. The values and virtues of the Kingdom of God as proclaimed by Jesus make sense of who we are and how (and why) we live the way we do. Last week in the second reading Saint Paul was writing to the church community at Ephesus this may be a wicked generation , a society which seems to be losing its moral compass, having attitudes and directions which appear to be taking us away from the Gospel teaching.....but your lives should redeem it ! Quite a challenge and a description of the vocation (the calling) which each one of us receives through our Baptism.

We may think ' what can I do about it?' but every small act of kindness, the attentiveness to the needs of others makes a difference and in that sense can be a means of 'redeeming' the world and the society in which we live. We have one Redeemer – Jesus Christ our Lord. What we are privileged to be are co-workers with Him in applying and making 'flesh and blood' the fruits of his Redemptive work though his Suffering and his Resurrection.

Pope Saint Leo the Great, who died in the year 461, writes:

O Christian be aware of your dignity – it is God's own nature that you share

If we ever wondered what is the purpose of our lives then he makes it clear that every life, whatever our faults and failings, has a great value and a great significance.
