Dear Parishioners

I have already spoken of the introduction of a **New Translation of the Scripture Readings at Mass.** All Catholic Churches in the British Isles are required to commence using the new Lectionary on the **1**st **Sunday of Advent, 1**st December 2024 and are obliged by the Archbishop to help parishioners prepare for this change. Prior to Covid we had a series of regular evenings **'Reflections on the Word'.** These were well supported. In these sessions we considered how our everyday lives are enriched by the scripture readings on successive Sundays. Fidelity to the original versions of the Word of God in Hebrew and Greek present particular challenges. At every Mass we ask ourselves what God is saying to us in the readings. The readings are a mirror that the Holy Spirit holds before us to help us recognise his voice in the circumstances of our lives. Revival of these evenings of reflection will provide an opportunity to tell the story of the new **'English Standard Version Catholic Edition'** and to experience first-hand how it differs from the existing **'Jerusalem Bible'** version. These sessions will be of interest to our Readers at Mass as well as to those who wish to deepen their understanding of the scriptures. The first of these sessions will take place next week at **7.00pm on Wednesday 18**th **September** at **St Anthony's Pastoral Centre, Onchan.** In addition to the resumption of these regular meetings there will be **A SINGLE ONE-OFF SESSION FOR PARISHIONERS ON THE TRANSITION TO THE NEW LECTIONARY WHICH ALL READERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND. This will be held at 10.00am in St Anthony's Pastoral Centre on Saturday 26**th **October.**

Adoremus Eucharistic Pilgrimages are taking place next Saturday 21st September at both the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King and the Cathedral Church of Saint Mary of the Isle Douglas. Our day of Eucharistic Adoration starts at 10.00am at St Mary's and finishes with the usual 5.00pm Saturday evening Mass. The pilgrimage is for parishioners from all our Catholic churches on the Island. St Anthony's Onchan and St Mary of the Isle parishes will take care of the period from 10.00am to 12noon. Saint Mary's choir have kindly agreed to accompany us. St Patrick's Peel and Our Lady Star of the Sea & St Maughold Ramsey will take care of the period from 12.00 to 2.00pm with St Mary's Castletown and St Columba's Port Erin leading from 2.00pm until 4.00pm. St Mary of the Isle and St Anthony's will also take care of the final hour until Mass at 5.00pm. Please note that the usual Saturday morning Confessions will still take place from 11am - 12 noon during Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

Once again, the Mayor of Douglas, Councillor Natalie Byron-Teare is joining us for Mass at 11.00am on Sunday 22nd September at the Cathedral Church of Saint Mary of the Isle for their Annual Civic Service. In addition to elected members and officers the Mass will also be attended by The Lieutenant Governor Sir John Lorimer and Lady Lorimer, Mr Mark Blundell, Lord Lieutenant of Merseyside and Councillor Richard Kemp CBE, Lord Mayor of Liverpool. Children from Saint Mary's school will also be joining us. There will be refreshments after Mass.

This year's **Novena to Mary Untier of Knots** will take place from **Sunday 13th October to Monday 21st October. Bishop Tom Williams** has kindly agreed to begin our novena with a celebration of **the Sacrament of the Sick, at 3.00pm on Sunday 13th October. In previous years many of you arranged for sick and elderly parishioners to attend.** Details of the remaining eight days of the novena will be announced when available.

Eucharistic Ministers are required to have their ministry periodically renewed. This involves a formal training session and recommissioning ceremony with the presentation to each minister of a *pagella* or certificate signed by the Archbishop authorising their ministry. This is required if they wish to continue in their role. A day of renewal was last held in November 2019. **Elizabeth Parsons,** Director of the Pastoral Development Department and **Mark Robson** are travelling to the Island to conduct a **Training and Recommissioning event to be held from 10.00am to 1.00pm in St Anthony's Pastoral Centre on Saturday 5th October.** Please record this date in your diaries. All Eucharistic Ministers are requested to attend.

This coming week we welcome Fr Dennis Ortese Yiye CSSp to the Island. A Nigerian priest, he will be living in community with fellow Spiritan priest Fr Joseph Kiganda in Castletown and assisting us in St Anthony's and St Mary's.

On Sunday evening and Monday I attended the Vigil and Requiem Mass for my friend Monsignor Michael McKenna.
