We are well and truly into the Autumn season. This coming Friday 4 October is the feast of St Francis of Assisi. It is also CAFOD Family Fast Day. CAFOD's supporting prayer this year is:

Praise be to you, O God, source of life and goodness. You fill the earth with abundance and love all that you have made. As we join creation in singing your glory, teach us to care for our common home. Praise be to you, O God, revealed in Jesus, God with us. We hear the call of the Carpenter, to carve a path to a better future. Guide our hands to repair what's broken, to build a just and peaceful world. Praise be to you, O God, who enfolds us with the Spirit, to call us deeper into the heart of love, to comfort and disturb. Give us strength and courage to work with you to make all things new. Amen.

**Eucharistic Ministers**: As reported in the newsletter of 26<sup>th</sup> May our Parish Council discussed Archdiocesan requirements regarding Safeguarding, Data Protection and Health and Safety on 15<sup>th</sup> May. Each of these has a bearing on a range of parish activities such as Eucharistic Ministers, parish meetings and the Lourdes Pilgrimage. In the newsletter of 4th and 11th August I spoke about the requirement for Eucharistic Ministers to have their ministry renewed at a formal training session on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> October followed at a later date by the presentation to each minister of a *pagella* or certificate signed by the Archbishop authorising them to exercise this ministry for a period of five years. A day of renewal for Eucharistic ministers was last held in November 2019 – this means that all current Eucharistic Ministers require their training to be updated and their authorisation renewed. Also announced in the newsletter of 4<sup>th</sup> August, Elizabeth Parsons, Director of the Pastoral Development Department and Mark Robson are travelling to the Island to conduct this Training Event from 10.00am to 1.00pm on next Saturday 5th October in St Anthony's Pastoral Centre. All Eucharistic Ministers are required to attend if they wish to continue in their role.

This week we continue our sessions of **Reflections on the Word** at St Anthony's Pastoral Centre on **Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October at 7.00pm.** We look specifically at both versions of the readings for the following Sunday to apply them to our daily lives. All are welcome. We are also learning more about the new **'English Standard Version, Catholic Edition'** of the Bible which is to be introduced at Masses throughout the British Isles on 1<sup>st</sup> December, the First Sunday of Advent. This new translation will replace the existing Jerusalem Bible version which has been in use since 1969. In addition, there will be a single one-off session on the transition to the new lectionary which all readers are encouraged to attend. This will be held from **10.00am to 1.00pm at St Anthony's Pastoral Centre** on **Saturday 26th October.** The morning will include information on the structure and content of the new Lectionary and an update in training for readers.

**Archdiocese of Liverpool Lourdes Youth Pilgrimage 2025** will take place from 23 July to 1 August 2025. Application forms will go online on **Monday 7 October 2024** when young people aged 15-22 can apply at <u>www.liverpoollourdesyouth.co.uk</u>. You can also see posters and flyers at the back of church. There are some changes to leaders and safeguarding procedures with the Archdiocesan Youth Pilgrimage for next year. We are liaising with them about this. The cost for each young person travelling from Liverpool is £710. Deposit of £100 to be paid on application.
