Adoremus

In preparation for the Holy Year of 2025 Saturday 21st September will be a day of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. For the Island it will be held at St. Mary's, Douglas from 10am until 5pm on the 21st. The first two hours will be organised by Douglas and Onchan Parishes. The second two hours, from midday until 2pm, will be the responsibility of Ramsey and Peel parishes. There will be periods of silent adoration and also communal prayer. The Sacrament of Confession will be available. All parishioners are urged to participate for as long as practical. There will be no 12.30pm Mass in Ramsey on that day.

For those who remember that 8th September is normally kept in the Liturgy as the **Birthday of Our Lady.....** as this year 8th September falls on a Sunday it is not kept in the liturgy: the Sunday, which is always kept as a Solemnity, takes precedence over any Feast of Mary or the Saints.

Today (8th September) Father Brian celebrates the Golden Jubilee - 50 years - of his Religious Profession in the Spiritan Order. As he is celebrating it with his Confreres in Dublin this weekend our prayers and congratulations go across the sea to Ireland.....

Father Philip send this deepest gratitude for your warmth of welcome and hospitality to him over this past month. He returns to Rome towards the end of September. Please remember the Beda College in your prayers.

Today there is a Second Collection for the work of the Comboni Missionaries. A Religious Sister will make an appeal at our three Masses. The Comboni Missionaries were founded by Daniel Comboni who was born in Limone, Italy, in 1831. Daniel knew at an early age that he would be a priest and missionary. His love was Africa, and in 1854, when God called him there, Daniel answered with all his heart and soul. Saint Daniel devised a Plan not just to bring the Gospel to people who never heard it but also to prepare Africans to evangelize their own people — a revolutionary idea for his time. His motto, "Save Africa with Africa," captures the essence of the trust he had in the African peoples.

Named the first Bishop of Central Africa in 1877, Saint Daniel continued his faithful ministry until, at the age of 50, worn out and plagued by fever, he died, but not before founding the Comboni Missionaries and Missionary Sisters who today carry out their founder's charism across Africa, Europe, Asia, and the Americas. Saint Daniel Comboni was canonized in 2003 and remains an inspiration to all who have a heart for the mission. We celebrate his feast day every October 10.
