<u>The Hail Mary</u>

Many of my non-Catholic Christian friends ask me why we pray to Mary rather than God. The simple answer is that we don't. We ask Mary, as with the other saints, to pray for us. It is interesting how those same Christians will happily ask their friends to pray for them but struggle with asking Saints to pray for them. Whilst we may get preoccupied, the Saints are able to focus all their time on prayer.

Consider the Hail Mary. The first half is straight from St. Luke's Gospel and combines the greeting that the angel Gabriel gives to Mary when he tells her she is to bear the Son of God and the greeting of Elizabeth when Mary goes to see her:

Greetings, favoured one. The Lord is with you (Luke 1:28) Blessed are you among women and blessed is the child you will bear! (Luke 1:42)

Elizabeth is the first in a long succession of generations to call Mary blessed and in the Hail Mary we continue that tradition.

In the second half of the prayer, we place our needs before Mary. While pregnant, Mary went to help her cousin Elizabeth who asked "Why should the mother of my Lord come to me?" We might ask the same question: "Why should Mary help me?" By giving us Jesus, her son, Mary is Mother of God and our mother; we can entrust all our cares and petitions to her.

In asking Mary to pray for us, we acknowledge ourselves to be poor sinners. There are only two times in our life that matter: now and the hour of our death. We ask Mary to pray for us now, but also to be there when we die as she was at her son's death on the cross. May she welcome us as our mother at the hour of our passing to lead us to her son, Jesus, in paradise.

As it says in the Catechism: Because of Mary's singular cooperation with the action of the Holy Spirit, the Church loves to pray in communion with the Virgin Mary, to magnify with her the great things the Lord has done for her, and to entrust supplications and praises to her. (CCC 2682)
