Dear Parishioners

Young people are sometimes dismissed as the 'snowflake' generation. But I find myself humbled by their sensitivity to injustice and unfairness in today's world. While we, the older generation, fumble around with 'realpolitik' and compromise, they are straightforwardly outraged by the blatant evil of the current slaughter in Gaza and Ukraine. They challenge the blindness of those in denial over the catastrophic consequences of climate change. They champion those subject to routine discrimination – be they LGBTQ+, minority ethnic, or even disabled. In short, they are more open to reading the signs of the times than those who hold the reins of power and manipulate them to their own short-term advantage.

Adept at navigating their electronic devices, young people are also exposed to **the negative consequences of social media:** online bullying and fake news. They are exploited by the purveyors of pornography, denying them healthy appreciation of sexuality and relationships. Appallingly, the trust of many young people has been betrayed by sexual abuse at the heart of the church. They are preyed on by those selling drugs and who even recruit them to exploit their own friends. Their fragile mental health is at risk in so many ways. Unlike previous generations, the networks of grandparents, aunties, uncles and cousins on whom we relied in the past are no longer available to them as extended families disperse across countries and even continents.

Young people have suffered most from the COVID pandemic. Their education has been interrupted. Literacy and numeracy has declined. While the majority of European countries offer free university education, students in the UK are saddled with debt for years to come. The likelihood of them ever getting to own their own homes is diminished. The possibility of saving for a deposit on a house is unlikely as their resources are diverted into paying exorbitant rents.

Speaking to a huge gathering of young people in East Timor this September, **Pope Francis** told them to respect the elderly and to love others regardless of differences, telling them "wreak havoc" and "make a mess". Young people challenge our complacency. They ask the awkward questions and address the elephants in the room. They are the prophets of our generation. Today, **the Feast of Christ the Universal King**, is also **Youth Sunday**. Pope Francis has described young people as 'The living hope of the church on the move'.

In the Baptism ceremony each candidate, child or adult, is anointed as *priest, prophet and king*. The model of Kingship we follow is not that of the dictator and overlord but that of the Servant King. 'Among the pagans the rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No, anyone who wants to be great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be your slave, just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.' (Matthew 20:26-28). These values are beautifully expressed in the hymn 'the Servant King'.

From heaven you came helpless babe; entered our world, your glory veiled Not to be served but to serve; and give Your life that we might live

This is our God, The Servant King; He calls us now to follow Him To bring our lives as a daily offering of worship to The Servant King

There in the garden of tears; my heavy load he chose to bear His heart with sorrow was torn, 'Yet not My will but Yours,' He said

Come see His hands and His feet, the scars that speak of sacrifice Hands that flung stars into space, to cruel nails surrendered

So let us learn how to serve and in our lives enthrone Him Each other's needs to prefer, for it is Christ we're serving. (Graham Kendrick 1983)
