Dear Parishioners

They say that most things happen in threes. That's certainly true of the coming of the Lord in Advent and Christmas. The early weeks of Advent foretell the coming of Christ at the end of time: 'The powers of the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.' (Luke 21:27). Last Sunday and this Sunday we hear John the Baptist's cry 'prepare the way for the Lord'. But it's not until 17th December that we begin to look forward to the impending birth of Jesus on Christmas Day. So what is the third coming of the Lord?

St Bernard of Clairvaux, a Cistercian monk wrote in the 11th century:

'We have come to know a **threefold coming of the Lord**. The third coming takes place between the other two. They are clearly manifest but the second is not. In the first coming the Lord was seen on earth and lived among men in the days when, as he himself bears witness, they saw him and hated him. In his last coming 'all flesh shall see the salvation of our God.... The other coming is hidden. In it only the chosen see him within themselves.....' Bernard goes on to quote Jesus "If anyone loves me they will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them"..... Where then are they (my words) to be kept? Without any doubt they are to be kept in the heart'.

In other words, this second coming depends on you and me. The Lord waits to be invited into the lives of each one of us. I am encouraged to make my faith personal; to move beyond compliance with the formalities of our faith and to embark on my own individual faith journey. He invites me to invite him: 'Behold I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come into him and eat with him, and he with me.' (Revelation 3:20). The Lord is polite and respectful. He doesn't barge in where he isn't invited. He is waiting for me to open the door of my own life and circumstances and let him in. A personal one-to-one conversation is required. How might this happen? It can take an experience of great sorrow or loss or failure or even great joy to bring about the realisation that not only am I dependent on God but that he doesn't judge me and that he's on my side. I don't have to bribe, cajole or browbeat him into loving me. I don't have to make promises that experience tells me I'm never going to keep. He loves me already and has always done so.

I renew and refresh my relationship with Lord at every Mass when I receive Holy Communion. Attendances at Mass can easily revert to a formality unless I personalise them with individual conversations with the Lord when I pray. Advent provides an opportunity to do just that.

Last Sunday, the day before the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Archbishop Malcolm declared the cure of John (Jack) Traynor during the first Liverpool Archdiocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes in 1923 to be a miracle. Jack was a casualty of the First World War. As a result of extensive injuries he suffered from epilepsy, paralysis of the right arm and paraplegia. Such was the scepticism of the War Office, Jack continued to a receive a disability pension from the UK government until the day he died, even though on his return to Liverpool from Lourdes, he set up a coal business and personally delivered sacks of coal for the rest of his working life. Each year thereafter Jack returned to Lourdes to help with the sick as a brancardier. One consequence of his injuries had been the insertion of a metal plate in his skull. It disappeared on the day of his miracle cure. My father was a brancardier in Lourdes alongside Jack in the 1920s and 30s. Dad had some French and Jack used to ask him in his strong Scouser accent: 'Tell 'em I had a 'ole in me head'.

Archbishop Malcolm's statement reads 'Given the weight of medical evidence, the testimony to the faith of John Traynor and his devotion to Our Blessed Lady, it is with great joy that I declare that the cure of John Traynor, from multiple serious medical conditions, is to be recognised as a miracle wrought by the power of God through the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes'.

Contrary to popular belief, of the many millions of sick people who have visited Lourdes since 1855, only 70 cures have been officially recognised by the church as a miracle. Jack's is now the 71st case and the first and only one from England. Fr John
