The Rhythm of Times and Seasons

On Epiphany Day, you may have heard in the Liturgy a little additional text read after the Gospel – it is called the **EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION** and it centres the whole 12 months which lie ahead of us on the suffering, death and Resurrection of Jesus which we celebrate each year at Easter.

As the coming months unfold, we will keep Ash Wednesday and Lent, Easter and the Ascension, Pentecost, the Solemnity of the Assumption and the Feast of our own name day (the Italians call it the Onomastico) and the Solemnity of our own Parish community and our local church.... all these days fall within the passing of the year and is rather poetically referred to as the 'rhythm of times and seasons'.

There are of course rhythms of times and seasons within our own lives..... the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties which are present for each one of us to differing degrees and in different ways as the year unfolds. In all of this we are PILGRIMS OF HOPE in this world (that is the theme for this current Holy Year) and something like the Epiphany Proclamation serves to ground everything we do in the Paschal Mystery of the Lord's dying, rising from the dead and the giving of the Holy Spirit who is the 'life - giver' and who keeps us faithful to Jesus' words and teaching.

The conclusion of the longer form of the Epiphany Proclamation is very deliberately and evidently echoing the prayer of Blessing of the Paschal Candle at Easter;

To Jesus Christ, who was, who is, and who is to come, Lord of time and history, be endless praise, for ever and ever. Amen
