<u>The Value of Pilgrimage</u> Buona Domenica – happy Sunday !

Last Tuesday (11th February) the Church kept the memory of Our Lady of Lourdes. As a shrine, Lourdes in the Pyrenees of France has been drawing people since 1858 when Mary appeared to Bernadette Soubirous and said that people should 'come here in procession' in order to honour the greatest gift which had been given to us in the Father's love – the suffering and risen Jesus who is always with his people.

The idea of journeying somewhere 'in procession' means movement – and our lives are indeed full of movement and growth and development. It also, in a very practical way, often means coming 'with others' – our Catholic Tradition often refers to procession as being something which is about the pilgrim - but not as a solitary activity but something we do alongside others. This is a great Truth of our Catholic Tradition ; We don't do this on our own – we need each other !

At the beginning of Mass we will often use a version of the Penetential Rite which say ' *I* ask Blessed Mary ever Virgin, all the angels and Saints, **AND YOU MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS**, to pray for me to the Lord our God.' We are privileged to be able to pray not only **WITH** others but also **FOR** others ...and they (we trust!) will pray for us as well.

The intercessions which we make at Mass are an opportunity to bring this very clearly to mind; **my** prayer becomes **our** prayer....just as the Lord taught us to pray **OUR FATHER....**
